Letter from the Pastor:

"Render to God not a tenth, not a third, not a half, but all that is God's, be it more or less, by employing all on yourself, your household, the household of faith, and all people, in such a manner that you may give a good account for your stewardship when ye can be no longer stewards." (John Wesley, "On the Use of Money," 1760)

We all have very deep-seated reasons why we give to the church. Mine goes back to the day I was baptized in a Baptist Church at 9 years old and, the next Sunday, I was given a box of offering envelopes. I would take the 50 cents that my stepfather would give me

for when the offering plate passed, and I would dutifully put it in my envelope, and place my envelope on the plate.

When I was a teenager and took after school and summer jobs, I no longer received money from my stepfather. I had to give from what I earned. No one told me how much of my earnings I should give, so I probably gave whatever was in my pocket if anything.

When I started studying for the Anglican priesthood, I came to understand that my relationship with money and goods was not just about how much I put on the offering plate but was also about my relationship with Jesus Christ. When I recognized that everything I have does not belong to me, but to God, I wanted to give a portion of what I had back to God in thanksgiving.

Our 2017 financial statements give a very clear picture of our financial future as things stand right now. Thanks to the generosity and stewardship of those who worshipped at First years ago, we have the resources to fund new ministries, to help us reach more people with the Gospel.

I hope you read more than the financial statements, but also the reports from me, our Council, and all our new ministries. To borrow a line from one of our local churches, "There's Life Here."

And this new life has been bearing fruit. Without too much asking, our offerings in 2017 increased by \$4,000. So, let me take this moment to say thank you. I take that as a gesture of hope, and hope will not disappoint.

In this newsletter you will read from our Pastor Intern, Jordan Smith, about why he gives. In future newsletters, I hope you will hear from more of our members. Take this time to consider why you give.


